

# The History Of The Late Mussar Movement

Rabbi Israel Salanter
Considered the Father of the late Mussar movement.

However, he gave credit to the Vilna Gaon.



**1809-1883 Lithuania** 

### Regarded the Rabbis as "Physicians" of the soul.

#### **Controversy**


- He shunned honor and rejected positions of power
- Rabi Salanter was opposed by some of the Kabbalists and Orthodoxy of his day as his movement was seen as divergent to some extent







